



# PASSOVER

## BETRAYAL AND COVENANT

Mk. 14:12-26



## Mark 14:12-22 (NASB77)

<sup>12</sup> And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover *lamb* was being sacrificed, His disciples •said to Him, "Where do You want us to go and prepare for You to eat the Passover?"

<sup>13</sup> And He •sent two of His disciples, and •said to them, "Go into the city, and a man will meet you carrying a pitcher of water; follow him;

<sup>14</sup> and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher says, 'Where is My guest room in which I may eat the Passover with My disciples?'"

<sup>15</sup> "And he himself will show you a large upper room furnished *and* ready; and prepare for us there."

<sup>16</sup> And the disciples went out, and came to the city, and found *it* just as He had told them; and they prepared the Passover.

<sup>17</sup> And when it was evening He •came with the twelve.

<sup>18</sup> And as they were reclining *at the table* and eating, Jesus said, "Truly I say to you that one of you will betray Me-- one who is eating with Me."

<sup>19</sup> They began to be grieved and to say to Him one by one, "Surely not I?"

<sup>20</sup> And He said to them, "*It is* one of the twelve, one who dips with Me in the bowl.

<sup>21</sup> "For the Son of Man *is to* go, just as it is written of Him; but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! *It would have been* good for that man if he had not been born."



**Mark 14:22-26 (NASB77)**

<sup>22</sup> And while they were eating, He took *some* bread, and after a blessing He broke *it*; and gave *it* to them, and said, "Take *it*; this is My body."

<sup>23</sup> And when He had taken a cup, *and* given thanks, He gave *it* to them; and they all drank from it.

<sup>24</sup> And He said to them, "This is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many.

<sup>25</sup> "Truly I say to you, I shall never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

<sup>26</sup> And after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.
